

Gifted and Talented Education A Short Guide to the Seminar Program

Program Description and Resources

GATE SEMINAR:

Students who meet the multicriterion standards are identified as a GATE Seminar student. This includes a score in the ability range greater or equal to three standard deviations above the mean, high academic achievement, and characteristics of Gifted students. Seminar students can be atypical learners who may require programs significantly differentiated from the more typical GATE Cluster programs. These classes support students in developing their exceptional potential. The Seminar program is intended to serve varied students who need extraordinarily high-level, advanced and challenging curricular activities; those with extremely high tested ability but low school achievement; or those students who are divergent thinkers and "march to a different drummer."

- Students must be District Seminar identified.
